## Conservatives

Postwar American conservatism, like it counterparts in Europe, understood security as having five dimensions: "national security," "law and order," religious and cultural continuity, economic stability for most workers, and regulation for safer products and a less dangerous environment.

To put it crudely, the story of American conservatism since the 1980s is the narrowing of the idea of security by stripping away these last two dimensions and upping the ante on the other three.
