The Constitution of the United States

From the census of 2000 it is easy to calculate that an amendment could be blocked by

thirty-four senators from the seventeen smallest states with a total population of 20,495,875, or 7.28 percent of the population of the United States.

If miraculously the amendment were to pass the Senate it could then be blocked by

thirteen state legislatures in the smallest states with a total population of 10,904,865, or 3.87 percent of the population of the United States.
