Democracy

It is of course easy to show that on any definition that is not simply vacuous, a majority *might* harm the interests of a minority, *might* act unjustly, *might* might indeed act tyranically.

But if every other alternative kind of regime would also permit injustice and tyranny, then it can hardly be counted as a unique defect of democracy or the majority principle that they do not totally foreclose these possible wrongs. Surely a question to ask is whether democracy is more prone to this kind of wrongdoing than any of the alternatives to it.
