Fascism

I prefer the adjective "fascistic" because it recognizes similarities without implying a central core. The adjective is a cluster concept: a cluster of ideas and values that are found frequently but not universally. This concept allows us to recognize the fascistic elements of the Klan's 1920s career without branding it as a fascist organization. Even the American groups that called themselves fascist typically shared some but not all characteristics and ideas.
