Armed with census data,
Republican lawmakers
[in Wisconsin in 2011]
drew districts to maximise
their political advantage.
In the 2012 elections,
Republicans won 48.6% of the vote
but took 60 of the state assembly's
99 seats.,

In 2014 and 2016, their 52% of the vote got them 63 and 64 seats.
