Gerrymandering

[O]ur main point is that "natural" one-party districts, even more than gerrymandered districts, contribute to noncompetitivemess and party polarization. Gerrymandering should be easy to fix, by entrusting the drawing of district boundaries to independent commissions rather than partisan state legislatures as several states have begun doing. ... however, the probem of "natural" one-party districts is much knottier and harder to solve.
