To call America a nation of immigrants is not wrong, either as a factual statement or an evocation of American myth.

But that fact coexists with this one: Over the past century, the United States has deported more immigrants than it has allowed in.

Since 1882, it has deported more than 57 million people, most of them Latino, according to Adam Goodman, a historian at the University of Illinois at Chicago.

No other country has carried out this many deportations.
