Money in politics

In the 2015-16 election cycle, business outspent labor \$3.4 billion to \$213 million. a ratio of 16 to 1, according to the nonpartisan Center for Responsive Politics. All of the nation's unions, taken together, spend about \$48 million a year for lobbying in Washington, while corporate America spends \$3 billion. Little wonder that many lawmakers seem vastly more interested in cutting taxes on cororations than in raising the minimum wage.
