a causal link can be drawn
between a discrete populist act (Brexit).
and national economic underachievement.
Sure enough, politics there has corrected
somewhat with chastened voters turning
towards sensible-to-bland politicians
as though it were 2005 again. The lesson?
In order to get over populism, a country
must suffer materially at the hands of it.
(The moral case against populism

isn't enough.) The surprise is that such economic damage has been so rare.
