Voting rights

Five unelected Supreme Court justices dismantled an unmistakingly democratizing law, the VRA (Voting Rights Act), which had been passed and renewed on muitiple occasions. In 2019, when efforts to restore the VRA were blocked by a Republican Senate majority. that majority represented seven million fewer voters than the Senate Democratic minority that backed it. In January 2022, when majorities in both houses of Congress — and more than 60 percent of Americans backed voting rights legislation, it was blocked by a minority in the Senate.
