Voting rights

The laws are there, and the rules are there, and basically the government, the government will stand behind them and give them the the right to vote. We have that.

The things they're talking about now are in court. Marc Elias has an awful lot of that that in court. The courts have struck down, like in Ohio, they struck down gerrymandering.

Things are happening. We act like we are going to obstruct people from voting; that is not going to happen.

Joe Manchin, January 18,2022, when asked about fears of voter suppression [There is no Constitutional right to vote. Elias is a voting rights lawyer and may not win in court. Ohio's map was overturned because it had a law prohibiting gerrymandering.]
