War

In modern times, when major powers invade smaller countries, they usually end up losing. America failed in Vietnam, Afghanistan and Iraq—and also beat humiliating retreats after smaller military interventions in Somalia and Lebanon.

The Soviet Union failed in Afghanistan; and Russia is now failing in Ukraine.

The few exceptions to the rule that great powers lose small wars seem to occur when the fighting and objective are clearly limited. If the conflict is genuinely a "special military operation" (to use Putin's disingenuous term for the invasion of Ukraine), then success is possible. In the 1991 Gulf war, the US-led coalition

restricted its goals to expelling Saddam Hussein's Iraq from Kuwait.
